Almost six months down! 2019 just keeps zooming by! This summer will definitely be a busy one for 4:12 Youth Ministry! Starting with June 6th and 13th, our group will be going to the Scott Country Clearinghouse to volunteer. On June 8th we will be having our semi-annual lock-in, followed by our annual youth Sunday on the 9th, with the church-wide family picnic after worship. We will be volunteering at KCBC's booth at Old Settler's on the 14th & 15th, then leaving for TEEN Camp after the Community Service on the 16th! Then on June 29th we leave for our mission trip to Monson, Massachusetts.

Over the last month on Wednesday nights, we have been taking a look at the Holy Spirit. We have dived into scripture seeing how He works as a whole with the Trinity and how He works in our lives today. We have studied how theologians experienced and described the Holy Spirit and how it parallels with us today. This study is a continuation of Canvas, which we have been going through since the beginning of the year. We began with Canvas: A Portrait of God then went to Canvas: A Portrait of Jesus to where we are now, Canvas: A Portrait of the Holy Spirit. When we finish the Holy Spirit, we will then move to Canvas: A Portrait of Grace. Every week I see these teens growing in their faith, it is amazing to see the work that God is doing in their lives!

As I always end my letters, I thank you for your continued support of this ministry. God is using your gifts to bless these youth and their faith is becoming more real. They understand that "religion" is so much more than words and deeds. They know that they need a true, deep relationship with their Creator, and that that relationship only comes through the acceptance and relationship with Jesus Christ.
