

Dear Church Family,

I wonder how many times in the past week that I have expressed amazement because Christmas is right around the corner. While this holy observance occurs every year on 25 December it seems like the space between one celebration and the next comes closer and closer. I guess that is just part of getting older, so I am told!

While it is getting closer, it is not here yet. Before we reach the manger, we first travel through the season of Advent.

What is Advent, you might ask? Isn't that just the counting off the weeks until Christmas Day?

In one sense, yes. But it is considerably more.

Advent, which comes from a Latin word meaning "coming," originally was focused on the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. So why does it come immediately before the observance of Christ's first appearance? The idea is that we can trust that Christ will come again because He said He will and proved it by coming the first time.

There are many ways of keeping this season holy, which includes the enjoyment of the merriment that it brings. Yet Advent, like Lent, was originally a season of spiritual preparation that included fasting and repenting.

Did he just say fasting before Christmas!?! Yes, that is all part of the historical season that we know as Advent.

Let me speak clearly here...I am not implying that we turn our backs on the festivities that accompanies this joyous season. What I am suggesting is that we don't focus on the feasting so much that we forget the "reason for the season." Let's make sure that we are not at such a full throttle in the next few weeks that we forget to worship the One who came and is coming again.

Believe it or not, I have had people tell me that they were too busy to attend worship or church activities because they were so busy with Christmas! I think it is safe to say that if you are that busy you are not focused on Jesus Christ but on something else. We must not party so hard that we walk right by the One that we are having the party for in the first place!

Here are some thoughts on how we can rightly observe this season:

- *Keep the worship of our Lord and Savior in first place. Truly enjoy the glory of the season.
- *Make time to slow down and read from God's Word. Don't get so caught up in the fun that we forget to listen to God speaking to us all.
- *Remember that the original Christmas was far from perfect. I think there is something about a questionable couple who had no place to stay after a long journey. I wonder who in our lives or our community needs us to think of them in their difficult situation?
- *By all means, enjoy the gaiety with family and friends but don't let that be a substitute for focusing on the Lord Jesus Christ.
- *Spend time with family and friends but don't forget your church family. Come gather with us as we celebrate the joy of the
