Dear Church Family,

I have two important items to share with you all this month. One deals with when we are coming back together as a church family and the second is concerned with our communication infrastructure.

Like you I am ready for us to return to our times of public worship, Bible study, and activities. On an almost daily basis someone will ask, "When are we going to open back up?"

This is a question that I seek the Lord's guidance and analyze on a daily basis. As the governor has begun to allow churches to reopen their doors and for businesses to resume normal schedules, I ask the Lord daily, "Is it time for us as well?" I have not yet sensed God's timing, but I know it will be soon.

I have two concerns that weigh heavy on me. The first is the overall age of our congregation is well within the most vulnerable for contracting this virus. I love you all and I have not been willing to put anyone in danger.

The second is that there is so much that we do not know about this virus yet. I do not want us to open prematurely, only for the governor to "backtrack" and reclose various establishments.

With both of these thoughts, I sense the Lord directing us to respond slowly and make sure that we do things right. Presently, the forecast from the state is that assemblies of 250 or more will be allowed the middle of June. I am looking at this for an approximate timetable and I am purposely not naming a date yet, but my hope is to do so in the next two weeks. When

that date is set, we will communicate with you all by e-mail, social media, phone calls, and maybe smoke signals (yes, I'm kidding about the last one! SMILE). During this time of isolation, we have been learning new ways of reaching out. A major item has been through the

broadcast of worship services via the internet. While this has been a timely means of keeping us together for worship (while distanced), it has not been a simple process.

I wished that sharing via internet was as simple as pressing a button, but it is not. We have found a need to update many items in order to do our weekly transmissions which, of course, costs money. Let me tell you about a blessing the Lord has given us.

We applied to the Center for Congregations (an Indiana non-profit that administers grants from the Lilly Foundation) for a Connect Through Tech Grant that was designed for churches to upgrade their infrastructure, just like we needed. Proceeds are designed to be used to help churches enhance their internet connections, upgrade needed equipment, and purchase new items that will enable churches to extend their ministry during this season of social distancing to our congregation and community. I am pleased to report that we were awarded a grant of \$3,420.00!

Since we received notification of the grant's approval, we have changed internet providers and purchased needed equipment, including a Web camera. We are already receiving positive feedback about the reception from many of you. With this said there are still complications and we are working on resolving these problems, but I praise God for His blessings.

Another question I receive on a regular basis is "will we continue to have worship services on the internet after this?" Yes, we will, and these upgrades will make this possible.

In last month's newsletter I quoted from the Prophet Isaiah (43:16-19), when the Lord tells us that He is bringing us to a "new thing." I do not have to tell any of you that we are living in a different day and time, and yes, even trying.

But you know, the Lord frequently (most of the time?) brings His greatest gifts after days of difficulty, after times we are called to practice our faithfulness to Him. While this is not how I would have planned for change in our lives, I can say with (continued on page 4)
