

Dear Church Family,

One of the surprising thoughts for many is that as American Baptists we had no sort of family structure larger than the local association for many years. Due to our insistence on the autonomy or independence of each congregation there were no such organizations as national or regional bodies for nearly two-hundred years.

How did this change? It developed from a desire to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with the entire world, something that was difficult to do without coming together. This missional impulse is what empowered independent churches to come together as the American Baptist family.

Ever since 1814, with the constitution of what is now known as American Baptist International Ministries, the sending and support of missionaries around the globe has been a vital component of our DNA. I count it as a joy to get to know these global servants firsthand and be a part of backing their essential ministries.

October is a special reminder of our joining together as we promote and receive the World Mission Offering. The WMO is one of the major means of raising the necessary financial support for our 121 missionaries who serve world-wide. As a church, we earmark 100% of our collection for the support of Nzunga Mabudiga and Kihomi Ngwemi, our special-focus missionaries who are in the Republic of Haiti.

Have you ever wondered what missionaries do? Well, Nzunga and Kihomi serve in several vital areas in their Haitian mission:

*They both are our American Baptist partners with the Haitian Baptist Convention, preaching in churches and working in a variety of ministries.

*Nzunga is a theology professor at the Christian University of Northern Haiti, which includes teaching other instructors and administering a scholarship program. He also manages a goat and pig ministry for children, directs a clean water project, and oversees the Cap-Haitian Eye Clinic.

*Kihomi serves as a counselor, works with women's health and community health evangelism, and economic development. She also advises and coordinates the Women's Association of the Haitian Baptist Convention.

Did you notice that a lot of their time and effort is focused on meeting the physical needs of the people? This is because Haiti is one of the poorest nations in the world and we are reaching "the least of these" (Matthew 25:40) when we support Nzunga and Kihomi's ministries.
