Dear Church Family,

As I am writing these words, we are in the midst of the Advent and Christmas season and another year is coming to a close. And what a year it has been!

Many of us we are saying "good riddance" to 2020. We are only too glad to put COVID, masks, and social distancing behind us, BUT the epidemic is still with us and in the last couple of weeks restrictions have been renewed. Even a recent issue of *Time* had 2020 on the front cover X-ed out with the by-line under it: "The Worst Year Ever."

And we wonder, will this ever end. We are changing a calendar but is there any hope in sight?

I am reminded of a favorite scripture for many of us that is found in Psalm 118:24: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." How do we rejoice in the difficult days of our lives? We do not rejoice in the struggles themselves but in the Lord we serve. We must keep our focus on Jesus Christ.

How do we keep this focus? The beginning step comes in accepting our Lord's grace in our lives by saying "yes" to His gift of salvation. We must surrender our lives to Him and accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. There are no substitutes. Jesus is first and foremost!

As Christians—people who have accepted Jesus into our lives—how do we continue to grow in God's grace (II Peter 3:18)? Again, we focus not on our circumstances but on the Lord we serve. What are means to our focus on Jesus? There are several:

- 1. Bathe our lives in God's Word, allowing it to give us the mind of Christ (I Corinthians 2:16).
- 2. Communicate with God in prayer, Who is the source of our strength (Psalm 86:6).
- 3. Be faithful in returning God's tithes and offerings to Him, as a reminder of Who blesses us in the first place (Malachi 3:9-10).
- 4. Share the reason for the hope that we have in Jesus Christ so that others can experience Him in their lives (I Peter 3:15).
- 5. Dedicate time to the public assembling of God's people, that we may encourage one another (Hebrews 10:25).

Now, I know that last one will turn some heads. "Pastor, how can we come together during an epidemic?" Many of us (even most of us?) are still able to go out and about and do all week long with work, shopping, etc. We can assemble together without question. Due to illnesses, medical conditions, etc. many cannot do so, but they can be a part of our public worship through many avenues of media—radio, Facebook, etc.—and even Bible study through Zoom on Thursday evenings.

We can all join together in one manner or another. Worshipping together in person is the best, without question, but there is a means for EVERYONE of us to do so. Let's not forsake the assembly. (continued on page 3)

The peace of God can reign in our hearts, even now, in this year of loss, grief, pain and confusion.

May we remember that "God is Not Dead, Nor doth He Sleep" this New Year. There is hope, an everlasting hope in our Savior, Jesus Christ.
