Dear Church Family,

This resumption on Wednesdays will include Adult Bible Study, 4:12 Youth Ministry, and Team Kid. For the present it will not include our Family Mealtime (we will revisit its resumption at a later date). These mid-week activities will recommence on 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, 7 April 2021.
