Dear Church Family,

Easter is always a joyous time in the church year, but it was especially exciting as we saw so many of you in worship for the first time since the events of this past year! While there are still many and serious concerns relating to COVID, you can tell that we are beginning to "thaw out" from the pandemic.

With having so many parts of our lives shut down it has truly been a time of contemplation. So many things in our lives that we take for granted are being examined and thought back out, some perhaps for the first time for many of us.

One of the buzz words in clergy-circles is that we are in a "new normal." While things are letting up, we are not quite returning to where we were before—or "normal"—but a place where things have changed due to social distancing. How will we react and live in this new season?

This is a vital question in the life of our Church and one that we need to give careful consideration. What does God want us to BE as a Church body? How does the Lord want us to reach our community for Him? What are ways that we can strengthen the bond of fellowship in our "life together?"

I want to spend some time in the month of May building the foundation for asking these questions, and others besides. Each Sunday I will be asking the question, "What is the Work of the Church?" and present a model for us to visualize what five areas we are called to focus on as "the hands and feet of Christ."

Without giving too much away, all five foci for the Church grow out of the Great Commandment as found in Matthew 22:37-40:

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."

This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: "Love your neighbor

as yourself." All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.

These words are general orders no. 1, if you will, for all Christians (those of you who have been in the military will understand this title). The Great Commandment is basic for every Christian in our daily walk with the Lord as individuals and as a church body.

These words are so important that I encourage you to memorize these words of scripture. Whenever we have a question in our lives, we should be able to instantly call these words of our Lord from memory and apply them to circumstances we find ourselves facing.

As we lay this groundwork, I am looking forward to our future discussions of who the Lord wants us to BE as His body and how we will embrace this "new normal" under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. As many are concerned about what the future holds, I am looking with expectation and excitement of how God is preparing to bless us anew and afresh!
