

Dear Church Family,

One of the vital ministries that we conduct year-round as a Church is our Wednesday evening Bible studies. Each week there is a group meeting with the entire family in mind: Adult Bible study, 4:12 Youth Bible study, and Kingdom Kids. I say each week, but our August schedule will be a little different this time around.

Every month we conduct our Church's Business meeting on one Wednesday night which postpones the adult study (this time that will be 11 August), but not the Youth or Children, which meet every week. In addition to this one monthly exception, we will also cancel services on 25 August for our end of the summer picnic at Bobby and Barb Deal's—or what I like to call the "Barb Bash"—and all age groups will head over to their home to enjoy an evening of food, fun, and fellowship.

During the actual Bible study sessions in August, each age group will be conducting unique studies from God's Word that I highly recommend to you all. Kingdom Kids is doing a study on "The Books of the Bible" and learning an overview of what is found in God's Word. The 4:12 Youth will be studying from the Old Testament. The Adults will be learning about "The Feasts of the Bible" that were observed by the Jewish people and are found in the Old Testament and their importance for us (on the first Wednesday, 4 August, I will be on vacation and Deacon Larry Blevins will be leading a stand-alone study for that evening).

One thing that we have all missed during the season of COVID is our Wednesday evening family meals that take place an hour prior (5:30) to our Bible study times. I am pleased to share that we will be resuming this "breaking of bread" on 1 September. There is a volunteer list on the bulletin board across from the church office for folks to prepare these meals. Please sign-up right away so that we can resume this vital ministry—and folks, it really is a ministry. Thank you for your faithfulness.

If you are not in the habit of coming to our Wednesday Bible Studies, I cannot urge you enough to come and check them out. As we mentioned, there is a group with every age in mind and each one meets each Wednesday at 6:30.

Come and join this excellent opportunity to read and study God's Word with others as we all seek to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior." Y'all come!
