

Dear Church Family,

Well, it's November but it is only weeks away until...

The temperatures have been a little cooler than they have been. This past week we had a few snow flurries, but nothing that accumulated. And holiday items have appeared in all the stores. In a few days the calendar will flip over to December.

...yes, it's beginning to look a lot like Christmas!

How did the folks in Bible times know that the approach of the Messiah, the Christ, was inching nearer? When we read through the Old Testament, we find a ton of prophecies that spoke to the time coming closer. Included in those promises was one that dealt with a particular family, the family of David. Unfortunately, it appears that people forgot the words of Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit."

Who is Jesse? I thought we were talking about David! Jesse was the father of David, the greatest of the Israelite kings.

And it was to this model monarch that God promised that his descendant would always be on the throne (II Samuel 7:11-12; Psalm 132:11). One even greater than David, the Messiah Himself.

We have many traditions connected with the Advent and Christmas seasons, but there is one that helps us to visualize God's promise to David through his heirs. The Jesse Tree.

The tree is simply one that is decorated with special ornaments, those that remind us of the promise that was delivered through David's descendants (the imagery of the tree, stump, and branches is taken from Isaiah 11). You can hang these meaningful symbols on your Christmas tree in your home or set aside an additional tree to fulfil the job.

During the Advent season, Pam and I will be making ornaments that remind us of the ancestors of Jesus the Messiah. I will be sharing them with you each Sunday as we learn about the "Ornaments on God's Christmas Tree" as we read through Matthew 1 each Lord's Day.

Along with the lighting of the Advent candles, we will have a bare tree in the sanctuary that will be decorated each Sunday with these Ornaments of Blessing, Promise, Faithfulness, and Grace as we proceed through the season. Matthew 1 is scripture that we frequently jump over (the first seventeen verses is a genealogy list), but I will be sharing small portions each Sunday and I believe that you will find this a worthwhile sermon series that displays the wonders of God's providence and why we can place our trust in Him.

I will even have patterns available for you to make these ornaments with your family during this season of expectation and joy. Pam and I will be using craft foam, but you can use other material like cardboard, construction paper, or even Styrofoam that will do the job.

Come and join us as we worship the Messiah, Jesus Christ! He really is the reason for every season of our lives!
