Rev. Tim Mohon, Moderator called the meeting to order. Rev. Stan Carrol opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes from the previous meeting were unavailable.

The Financial Report was given by Judy Peacock, Treasurer. Following discussion, Missy Payne moved to accept the report as presented. Sue Payne seconded the motion, it carried and the Treasurer's Report was filed subject to audit.

Rev. Stan Carrol gave a report on the CCBA Fall Revival. Average attendance was 46, which was considered good for the pandemic situation. Offering for the week was \$1900, to be applied to the general budget. Many positive comments were made. Next years Fall Revival is on target to happen pending no complications from the pandemic.

Leah Griffin volunteered to contact Edna Martin Christian Center about providing a representative. Rev. Mohon also asked her if she would organize the music for the evening. She agreed.

Missy Payne, Editor of *The Shepherd* reported the need of contacts for some of our churches were needed to help provide more articles for *The Shepherd*. She would like to have more churches represented each month.
