Edna Martin Christian Center Food Drive

January is the month our association collects canned goods to deliver to Edna Martin Christian Center in Indianapolis. We hope you are already working on your collection. Here are some reminders/helpful hints for you:

*We are collecting either money or items from anyone who wishes to contribute. If you wish to contribute money, the best way is to give a check to Judy Peacock, association treasurer, for the amount you want to give, made payable to Coffee Creek Association (CCA), by February 6, 2022. She will then deposit these checks into the CCA checking account and withdraw the total in cash and give it to one of the CCA officers to be spent at Aldi's. You can see Judy at Kimberlin Creek Baptist Church or mail it to her at the church (4756 E. State Road 356, Scottsburg, IN, 471710) or call her at 812-595-1839.

*We provide food, paper, basic first aid supplies (band aids, tape, etc) and hygiene needs for their food pantry. Edna Martin Christian Center (EMCC) staff will divide our food items between their food pantry and their after-school program. I have included a copy of their "Food Pantry Wish List".

*EMCC wants us to have a total dollar amount of all the goods we donate so it is very helpful if you can include a note or receipt of the total dollar amount spent on your items. Giving an estimate on the dollar amount is also acceptable.

*We will be <u>shopping and delivering on Saturday, February 12, 2022</u>. We will meet at <u>Aldi's in Seymour</u> (1710 E Tipton St.) at 8:45 am, shop, load and deliver to EMCC. Everyone is welcome to join us for any part of or the entire event.

*We are in need of delivery vehicles. We estimate that we deliver between 5,000 and 10,000 pounds of goods to the EMCC. That is a lot of weight! Trailers that can be pulled with big trucks equipped with trailer brakes or large easily loadable farm trucks work best for this delivery. (Of course we can use smaller vehicles and load them to the max if need be.) Also, having covered vehicles is helpful to protect the goods as we travel. This is a great offering to give of your time, vehicle and gas! Please call Patty or Dale if you can supply vehicles or trailers.

*This is a joint venture between ABWM and AB Men in our association; Patty Short and Dale Armstrong are the coordinators. Patty can be reached at 812-595-1081; Dale can be reached at 812-701-6460. Please call either of them for any questions/coordination with drop offs, etc, you may have!

*This is an annual event that was started many years ago when Edna Martin herself travelled throughout Indiana and developed relationships with American Baptist Churches

to gain support for her ministry. We hope you will continue your support; remember every dollar helps!

*Please pray for our weather before and on February 12. The trip is more hazardous if it's raining, snowing or icy. Also pray that we have safe travels for our group.

Obituary for Rev. Stephen Aye Malone, first full-time on-site director for SBYCamp.

Rev. Stephen Aye Malone, 85, of Vernon, passed away at 1:20 p.m. on Saturday, January 15, 2022 at Our Hospice of South Central Indiana Inpatient Facility in Columbus. He was born on December 30, 1936 in Dana, Indiana the son of Harry Graden and Grace (Aye) Malone. Stephen had graduated from Dana High School in 1954 and attended Rose Hulman University. He graduated in 1972 from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and was ordained into the ministry in January 1971. He was a station agent and telegrapher for the B&O Railroad form 1957 until 1970. Rev. Malone and his wife served as managers of the Southeastern Baptist Youth Camp in Westport for 23 years. He had pastored churches in Columbus, Vernon, Waynetown and the Rock Creek Baptist Church in Westport for 38 years. He was a member of the Rock Creek Baptist Church, Jennings County Historical Society, Decatur County Historical Society, and an honorary member of the Ripley County Historical Society. He was a member of

Haley Tower Historical and Technological Society, sons of the Veterans of the Grand Army of the Republic, former member of Westport Kiwanis, he served as an officer of Sand Creek Baptist Association, International Fellowship of Christian and Jews and a past President of Indiana Baptist Minister Council. He was an avid reader and historian. His specialty was early churches in Indiana. He loved playing golf. He was a member of the sons of the American Revolution. He married Judith Wallace on November 30, 1958, in Clinton, Indiana and she survives. Other survivors include his daughters, Rev. Colleen Malone of Vernon, Angela (Oren) Griffin of Lafayette and Myrna (Ted) Kinney of Crawfordsville; his brothers, Morris Howard of Evansville, and Frank Howard of Illinois; his grandchildren, Stephen Griffin and Elaine Griffin of Lafayette, Meagan Lampkin of Seymour, Angela Eaton of North Vernon and Isaac Kinney of Kansas; 14 great grandchildren and great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, stepfather; 2 brothers and 1 great grandchild. There will be a visitation at the River of Life Church in North Vernon on Saturday, January 22, 2022 from 1:00 until 3:00 p.m. with a memorial service at 4:00 p.m. Burial will be at Rock Creek Cemetery at a later date. The Bass & Gasper Funeral Home in Westport has been entrusted with handling the funeral arrangements. Memorial contributions may be made through the funeral home to the Southeastern Baptist Youth Camp or the Mercy Rescue & Adoption.
