

Dear Church Family,

I am excited that we as a church family made the decision to license Tyler Griffin to the Gospel Ministry at our March 2022 business meeting. The actual licensure will take place on Sunday, 22 May at 3:00 p.m. and I encourage all of you to come and be a part of this special day.

I am sure that the question of what a license to the ministry is has come up among many of us. Let me seek to explain what this means, and what it does not mean.

First, what it does not mean. In our lifetimes most of us will apply to the state for a driver's license, a marriage license, a hunting license, and maybe even a business license. Let me make it clear that a License to the Gospel Ministry has nothing to do with the government, it is solely under the purview of a Baptist congregation.

The basic meaning of the word "license" is permission: someone is granted a license or permission to do something. This thought of "permission" is the key word to keep in mind.

While our Lord Jesus Christ calls individuals to the work of the ministry, the Church validates that call and gives permission to carry out that role in the life of the Church. We read in Ephesians 4:11-12 that: "It was [Christ] who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, that the body of Christ may be built up." As the Lord gives these individuals to His Kingdom, the Church recognizes and supports those called by means of ordination and license.

The Church grants authority for the full work of the Gospel Ministry through the act of ordination (we find Biblical examples of ordination in such places as Acts 6:1-6; Acts 13:1-3; I Timothy 4:14; II Timothy 1:6). While requirements vary by the local congregation, most American Baptists see this as a result of years of discernment, education, and experience. This practice culminates in the "laying on of hands" by other ordained ministers and deacons.

While ordination is carried out by the local church, we include other American Baptists in the process since it is recognized by our larger ABC family. In Baptist life (and many other denominations), those ordained as ministers are titled as "Reverend."

This brings us to license. Following the mandate of the Apostle Paul to "not be hasty in the laying on of hands" (I Timothy 5:22), Baptists have included in the ordination process a period of "testing" for both the candidate and the congregation to discern God's calling to the ministry. A license to the Gospel Ministry says to the candidate and to the world: "We can see God's hand on your life, and we believe He is calling you for greater service."

What will this mean practically for Pastor Tyler and our congregation? First, he will continue to minister to our youth and church as he is already doing. Second, he is now "in the pipeline," if you will, for future ordination. Third, the state of Indiana will accept his standing as a licensed American Baptist minister for purposes of conducting weddings.

I believe without question that our Lord Jesus Christ has placed a calling on Tyler's life. I see it daily in his commitment, passion, and work as our Youth Pastor. The two of us have discussed his licensing since early in my pastorate with you all and I am honored that we have come to this point in time.

Again, I let me urge all of you to be present on Sunday, 3 May 2022, as we invite our sister churches to be with us for this historic occasion in the life of Pastor Tyler and Leah, and in the life of our church family.
