

Dear Church Family,

In just a month, we will be coming up on an anniversary. Come November it will be four years since you all graciously opened your lives to include Pam and myself, as your Senior Pastor.

It has been a very busy four years. With all the normal aspects of ministry, we also have to include the difficult days of COVID and how that has given new perspectives and new challenges in how we do ministry.

I thank you all as we continue to do ministry together in our Lord's name. Your partnership in the gospel means everything to us.

As we think about ministry, how do we go about doing it? There are two basic requirements for conducting ministry: prayer and resources.

First, we cannot do ministry on our own, it happens through the Lord's strength and power. We are reminded in Psalm 127:1, that "unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain." The foundation for all ministry is seeking the Lord's blessing and favor in following His will for our lives.

Second, the Lord has provided the resources for doing ministry...and it is us! Remember, we are His hands and feet. The Lord chooses to work through you and me. I Corinthians 3:9 tells us that "we are Gods fellow workers. You are Gods field, Gods building." Resources include both are willing work and our willing giving. Let's be honest, ministry costs money.

When you look at our new year's budget (which just began on 1 September), you will see that we have a heart for ministry. Not only are there the expenses of pastoral ministry, youth ministry, worship ministry, and office and building ministry, but there are also the needed educational ministries, outreach ministries, and supporting mission ministries.

Since COVID our giving has been down, and we have been depending on our reserves. With only three weeks into a new financial year, we are approximately \$3,400 behind budget requirements. I say this not to proclaim, "doom and gloom," but to make sure you are aware of our needs, as I trust the Lord completely to supply those needs.

Let me encourage you to look at your giving. Are you faithful in returning the Lord's tithe? Have you gotten behind in your regular giving? Can you stretch and give a little more than you have in the past?

An example just in this month of October is the Fall Fest on Sunday, 16 October. We are praying for the Lord's blessing and leadership for this positive outreach to our community, and it will also expend resources—both willing hands and willing giving. Will you commit to pray, volunteer, and give to make this happen? This ministry is already budgeted and when you return the Lord's tithe and give your offerings, you make this outreach happen.

Again, thank you for your partnership in the ministry. Thank you for your prayers, willing hands, and cheerful giving.
