## **Disaster Relief**

I took 1 lady to Hazard to help flood victims on Sunday, September 25. We stayed 3 nights and helped in their distribution center as survivors came to get needed supplies. We also drove around and were still able to see remaining damage from the flood waters.

8 adults and 6 teenagers went to Bremen to help rebuild after their tornadoes on Wednesday, October 12. 4 adults and 3 teens were with us in June. These teens held car washes and bake sales prior to this trip and raised \$500 which was donated to Bremen's Disaster Relief Coordinator! We hung some sheet rock, did some mudding, caulked around windows/doors and helped in their distribution center warehouse. We stayed in a Methodist Church in Sacramento, KY, and ate lunch/supper at the firehouse.

Mission trips to both Hazard and Bremen are being planned for 2023 so watch for those dates to be announced very soon!
