Dear Church Family,

Happy New Year! Welcome to the beginning of a new season and the commencement of our walk with the Lord in this brand-new year.

At the start of 2023, it is only natural for us to assess our everyday lives. Many during these cold days will make resolutions involving finances, personal health, and time management. While "New Year's Resolutions" have a bad name—they seem so hard to keep—I do believe reevaluating our lives is always appropriate.

As we evaluate where we want to be in the upcoming twelve months, don't forget to consider your walk with the Lord. How can we do that you might ask? Let me take you to Acts chapter 2...

We read in the beginning portions about the Day of Pentecost, as the Lord fills the Church with the Holy Spirit, and the 120 or so go out to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with everyone they meet. Next, we note the Apostle Peter preaching to the crowds that had gathered and the Gospel touched their hearts deeply. Then we find the Apostle extending an altar call and about three thousand accepted Christ and were baptized.

In the last portion of the chapter, we learn of how these new Christians lived their lives differently. In Acts 2:42 we discover four major actions that they carried out in their walk with Christ: "They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Let me suggest this holy outline for our goals. How we can you, how we can "grow in the grace and knowledge" of Jesus Christ in 2023?

The last three actions we can visualize, but what is the apostles teaching? This teaching was carried out in two ways. First, the apostles shared about their eyewitness accounts of our Lord Jesus Christ. Then they taught from the Law, the Prophets, and the Writings, what we call the Old Testament.

How can we do this in 2023? Well, we still have the apostles' accounts of Jesus when we read from the Gospels, and all the New Testament, and of how the Old Testament points to the Christ. We are faithful to the apostle's teaching when we study the Bible.

Every Wednesday night we come together as a Church to do just this, study from God's Holy Word. At 6:30 we have a group for each age: Kingdom Kids, 4:12 Youth, and Adult Bible Study. AND, the Adults are currently studying in-depth from the Book of Acts!

We have a decent number come out each week (statistics are listed elsewhere in this issue), but we have room for a whole lot more to take advantage of this opportunity (only 10 or so come out for Adult Bible Study each week).

Adults let's set the example for our youth and children by making Bible study a priority. We can even make fellowship a priority when we come out for the Family meal at 5:30, prior to our 6:30 Bible study.

Here is a very worthwhile and achievable goal for all of us in 2023: let's give priority to Bible study. Y'all come!

Here is a short summary of this year's study:

GO DEEPER THAN SURFACE-LEVEL

Move beyond the fun and games and teach with resources that are centered in God's Word and draw students closer to God. **Amplify: Growing a Faith That Lasts** examines 17 foundational elements of faith, each using a three-lesson framework:

The Holy Spirit, Worship, God's Word, Obedience, God's Mercy, Evangelism, God's Sovereignty, Suffering, God's Righteousness, Holiness, Spiritual Gifts, Service, Humility, Knowing God (Knowability), Prayer, Stewardship, The Unchanging God (Immutability)

Your students have heart these faith-based words in church before. **Do they know what these words mean—and, more importantly—what these elements mean for their daily lives?**Pastor Tyler and Leah

An update from Nzunda & Kihomi: Dear Loved Ones,

Greeting. Wish we had a good news to share but unfortunately the news is not at all that encouraging. Haiti, our beloved country, had had many challenging situations. They are still dealing with gangs, shortage of gas, no transport in the country, high prices of goods, especially food, schools have closed for months now, and cholera epidemic is taking ground.

Sister Willienne Latouche of ACPEDES (Association Chretienne pour le Propagation de l'Evangile et du Development Economique et Sanitaire), our IM partenaire in the Southern Haiti has been overwhelmed with cholera cases. Sister Willienne is RN who runs her own clinic (health center), treating poor patients.

This past weekend people who attended the wedding in the mountains and ate the wedding food are all sick. Three had already died. And the rest are at Sister Willienne clinic getting treatment. It is the same sad news we are learning from the region of Jean Rable, Northwest of Haiti. Another wedding and another case of food poisoning.

Please let us keep our sisters and brothers in Haiti in our prayers.
