Edna Martin Christian Center Food Drive

It's time once again for our association to collect food (or money to buy food) and take it to Edna Martin Christian Center food pantry in Indianapolis. This has been a joint venture between AB Men and ABW for many years for our Coffee Creek Association. (Other associations of American Baptist Churches in our state support this food bank at other times of the year!) Their

food bank supplies food to many families who need help putting food on their tables as well as supports their before/after school programs.

We will meet at Aldi's in Seymour on Saturday, February 4 at 9 am to buy our food, load it and take it to Edna Martin Christian Center. Last year, we spent just over \$7800 at Aldi's and delivered all that to Edna Martin Christian Center. I wish we had gotten it weighed—I wonder how many tons of food that was?!!

You are welcome to join us at Aldi's and help with picking out the groceries and loading it. You are also welcome to drive with us to Indianapolis and help with the offloading if you wish.

The AB Men will be meeting on Thursday, February 2 at 6 pm at FBC of Austin (their ladies are preparing food ©) to make final plans for delivery of these goods. They need as many men to attend as possible. If you have a suggestion on delivery options (truck, trailor, etc.) please contact Pastor Stan Carroll (Alpha Baptist Church) at 812-282-7691 or Pastor Joshua Jackson at 812-707-1020 (FBC Austin).

If you wish, you may deliver your collected items to Kimberlin Creek Baptist Church to be added to our load. If you have money that you want us to spend at Aldi's on February 4, you may take it also to Kimberlin Creek Baptist Church. If you have cash, all you need to do is give it to Judy Peacock, the association treasurer. If you have a check, it needs to be made payable to "Coffee Creek Association" and given to Judy Peacock as soon as possible. Judy needs time to deposit the check then withdraw cash for us to spend at Aldi's. Judy also works as the church secretary for Kimberlin Creek so call her at church to make any arrangements. Did you know that the food must be ordered at Aldi's at least 2 weeks before we arrive? I feel somewhat nervous when it comes to placing our food order, without knowing just how much money each of our churches will contribute. It is a huge step of faith! Thank you to each church/individual who participates in this food drive.

Allow me to share a few facts on the life of Edna Martin as found in her biography by Wilma Rugh Taylor, titled *Sister of the Solid Rock*.

Edna Mae Barnes Martin was born on November 25, 1897 to parents William Barnes and Lemah Jones Barnes. Her childhood started in Mt. Vernon, Indiana, and eventually settled in Indianapolis in 1903.

Edna was baptized at the age of 17 by a pastor of an American Baptist Church. She immediately began evangelizing, starting with her mother and siblings. And that was the beginning! She felt called by God to minister to the community of Martindale, a predominately African American community of very poor (economically speaking) people. She married her

husband, Earl Martin, on September 12, 1921 and he completely supported his wife's mission efforts.

"In fall 1941, without financial or institutional support, she rented a room for \$14 a month in the apartments on Norman Court....Instead of offering just babysitting, social skills, and recreational opportunities, Edna wanted to win the children for Christ." (Page 43) A year later, she relocated to an unused circus tent. Edna said that she never knew where they would get money for food and other necessities but the Lord always provided for their needs. (Pages 43-44)

In 1945, the East Side Christian Center was born. (Page 45) Edna's ministry to children included meals, baths, clean clothes, music, drama, social skills and most important to her: evangelism. The mission moved to a 3 room shotgun house that had little heat, no water or bathrooms but lots of roaches and rats. Still it attracted children as only the magnet of love can do. This building was eventually condemned and a newer building was purchased. Growth continued then and still continues today.

An important note in the book is listed on Page 61: "Frequently Edna would travel to rural and small-town Baptist churches scattered across Indiana—such as in Warren... Scottsburg...... In many of those places, blacks were not welcome in white churches or public places." Did any of you ladies get to meet her during her travels in the 1950's and maybe very early 1960s? A few of our ABWM ladies from Bethel did meet her (all of those ladies are now with the Lord) and we treasure the 2 pictures we have of Mrs. Martin when she was visiting Bethel ladies.

Stories abound in this book that testifies to Mrs. Martin's love of people and her commitment to her God-given mission as well as many hardships and her perseverance during the journey. I encourage you to read the biography.

She was one woman devoted to our Lord and committed to following his leading. Her dedication to our Lord and her mission is an honor for us to continue to support. Thank you for being a part of her mission.

Why We Pray Poorly (from Today in the Word)

Friday, January 20 | <u>Luke 22:39-46</u>

A preacher once lamented, "My preaching is better than my praying, and my praying is better than my life." What he meant was that our prayers often reflect our aspirations more than they do our practice. But sometimes, our praying falls short as well. Why do we pray poorly?

We aren't alone. In Luke 22, we see Jesus with His disciples. After leaving the upper room, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Jesus withdrew about a stone's throw away and gave them one job, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation" (vv. 40–41). According to Matthew's version, Jesus said, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me" (Matt. 26:38). But instead of praying, the disciples slept! They weren't being lazy or insensitive. Luke offers a more natural explanation in verse 45 when he says the disciples were "exhausted from sorrow."

There are many reasons we pray poorly. We may be tired, stressed, or even ill. Sometimes we are distracted by the very problems that we bring to the Lord. Talking about our concerns causes us to think about them, and before we know it, we are just worrying aloud. When Jesus found the disciples sleeping, he woke them and urged them to get up and pray "so that you will not fall into temptation" (v. 45).

Some of the things that cause us to pray poorly are under our control. Others are not. But we do not need to pray well to be heard. It is better to pray poorly than not at all.

There are some simple ways to pray better. First, pray when you are most alert. Second, find a quiet place without distraction. Third, pray using a posture that is more likely to keep you from falling asleep. Some people keep a prayer list or write out their prayers.

No matter how you do it: just pray.
