

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As you know, the last couple of years have been difficult. Our world has changed with COVID and all of us are feeling it in our lives. Health and economic concerns are at the top of all our lists. And this includes our church...

For the last two years giving has been down, which is not surprising with the current economy and concerns. If you keep up with our monthly reports, you will see that we are about \$20,000 behind in our giving. This is a growing concern and as the leaders of our church we feel that we need to do something positive to turn this around.

Here is what we are proposing...first, we thank you all for your faithful giving. We know it has been tough and we want you to know that it is appreciated. If you are behind in giving your tithes and offerings, we encourage you to work on getting caught back up.

Second, over the months of February to April we are asking for an over and above offering to help us get caught up. While \$20,000 sounds like a lot (and it is!), it is a doable goal to reach this amount. If 40 people were to give \$500 over their normal giving or 50 were to give \$400 over their normal giving, we could easily reach this goal.

We are planning on a Commitment Sunday on February 12, in which we ask everyone who is willing to come to the altar and sign a commitment to give an over and above amount from then until April 30. This one time over and above pledge can be given in any way that you like to: weekly, monthly, or one-time gift. We will have envelopes made up specially for giving your pledges so that we can keep a track on how we are doing at reaching our goal. We will have various brackets of giving that you can commit to, such as \$100, \$250, \$500, \$1,000, and an empty line where you can say how much you are able to do over and above.

Before we go any further, we just want to say that as the leaders of our church we realize that we cannot ask you to do anything that we are not willing to do ourselves. With this said, each of us—Deacons and Pastors—are committed to give over and above our normal tithing and giving, just like we are asking each of you to do. We will be the first ones in line to sign our commitments and we will be giving. We say this not to brag, but to set the example for everyone. Again, we don't want to ask anyone to do what we are not willing to do ourselves.

When we give to the Lord, how does He use that? We are blessed to have a staff of five that we support for their services. We also have the responsibility of the upkeep of the Lord's house. We do a ton of ministry, with a lot of it directed towards our youth and children. And we are blessed to support ministry and missions in our community, our nation, and around the world. We want to keep on reaching out as the hands and feet of Jesus and doing all of what we do.

Thank you for your faithful giving and thank you for being a part of our ministry together.
