Dear Church Family,

Believe it or not, Spring has sprung. Yes, I know that it is still cool outside (and downright cold for several days!), but the many signs of changes are taking place.

The harbingers of a new time began with the commencement of the Lenten season last month and continued with the beginning of Daylight Savings Time a couple of weeks ago. As I look around the roadsides and in yards, I keep seeing plants that are popping up (perhaps prematurely, with the cool temps). The Vernal Equinox or the first day of Spring came just this week. AND...Easter is just around the corner!

Easter is my favorite day on the Christian calendar. It is the culmination of the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who gave His life on the cross, but now steps forward from the tomb victoriously in new life. New life that we can have as we accept His costly gift of salvation.

As we prepare to celebrate the joy of Easter, let me get you to put a few dates on your calendar and ask you to commit to be a part of the festivities:

- **2 April—Palm and Passion Sunday**. This will be a unique service that will be filled with the "Sights and Sounds of the Passion." The sermon, while completely focused on the Scriptures, will be dramatic in format. I encourage you to be here for this service. (10:30 a.m.)
- **5 April—Wednesday of Holy Week**. In place of our Bible study in the book of Acts, we will be focused on the Scriptures of Holy Week this evening, seeking to trace our Lord's actions and ministry. (6:30 p.m.)
- **6 April—Maundy Thursday**. We will be joining the Lexington Presbyterian Church as we gather around the Lord's Table on the evening of the Lord's Supper and the arrest of our Lord. (7:00 p.m.)
- **7 April—Good Friday**. We will host the Lexington Presbyterian Church as we approach the Cross in a time of quiet and reflection. We will view the reality of the Cross before we experience the joy of Easter. (7:00 p.m.)
- **9 April—SONrise Service**. With joy we will encounter the Empty Tomb and proclaim that "He Is Risen!" We will even enjoy breakfast together after the services. (7:30 a.m.)
- **9 April—Easter Sunday**. The festivities only continue, as we join together as the Family of God to worship and praise our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, "He Is Risen Indeed!" (10:30 a.m.)

You know, I find it as no surprise that we celebrate Easter in the renewal of Spring. After all, this season of rebirth and new life points to the greatest sign, the greatest symbol of New Life, that comes alone in our Lord Jesus Christ! Praise God the Tomb is still empty! He Lives! He Lives today!
