Have you ever had one of those times in working for God where you have witnessed his power and would expect others to turn from their sins and follow Christ only to have them continue in their sinful ways? How would that make you feel? In my devotions recently I was reading in first Kings and was reading about Elijah, and the powerful showing of God's power on Mt Carmel where it seemed all of Israel would turn from Baal and follow the one true God, except a few days later it seemed they had forgotten, and were right back where they started spiritually. Like many of us do sometimes Elijah got discouraged and walked away from all of it until he found himself in a cave on a mountain wishing he wasn't alive. It was there, when he was alone and depressed that God was able to deliver a personal message to Elijah. As Elijah was alone, he witnessed a great wind so powerful that it caused the rocks of the mountain to break; he also witnessed an earthquake, and a great fire, but after each phenomenon he realized God was not in them. Finally, after all the great and powerful displays there came a still small voice as gentle as a soft breeze and it was God. It was then that Elijah was awakened, and God told him to go back the way he came, and he did. Sometimes we are like Elijah we serve God compassionately and pray for and try to win our family and friends for Christ only to have them go a different direction and it leaves us down and discouraged because it seems like we are the only ones serving Christ, but just like God did with Elijah when we are finished with our woe is me attitude, he comes to us in that still small voice and sets us back on the right path. So, remember the next time it seems like our family and friends are going the wrong way, and chasing the glamorous things of the world, and Satan is telling you to give up just hold on, stay the course, and listen for that still small voice of God, and let him continue to guide your steps.
