Dear Church Family,

What do you think of when you think of October? Perhaps cooler weather, or football season? Possibly hayrides, or even Halloween?

Without question it is all these things, but it is also something even more important. In American Baptist life it is time for the World Mission Offering—a season in which we focus our sights and support upon our world-wide reach with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Since 1814, we as American Baptists have sought to share God's love around the world through missionary effort. From the very first outpost in present-day Myanmar to all the continents of the world...well, six anyways; we have never had one to the penguins in Antarctica, yet 😊

There are several funding sources for our unified mission work, with the main vehicle being the World Mission Offering. Taking and receiving the WMO is not only vital for the work of American Baptist International Ministries, it is also part of how we live out our Lord's command to share the Gospel with the whole world, or the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20).

We are commanded to go ourselves or to support those who do go, sharing the Gospel. Most of us will find it difficult to "go ourselves," but we can "go through others" by our support of their work.

There are two major means of support: prayer and giving. We must be faithful in taking all of the Lord's servants to His throne of grace. Just as we can do nothing for Him without His power, neither can they. Let's recommitment ourselves as a church to lift up our missionaries in prayer.

And, of course, through our financial gifts. While the WMO supports all the work of American Baptist International Ministries, our church has dedicated our contributions for the ministries of Nzunga Mabudiga and Kihomi Ngwemi.

Our goal for the 2023 World Mission Offering is \$1,300.00. Please pray about how you and your family will give to support the work of Nzunga and Kihomi, who are no longer in Haiti but now serve in the Dominican Republic (the nation next door, but still working with Haitians who have crossed the border). You will find offering envelopes in the pews to bring your gifts, whether you make a one-time gift or give weekly during this season (I found a long time ago that we could give more if we divided our contributions into weekly amounts; whatever works best for you and yours).
