

Dear Church Family,

One of the greatest ways that we can minister and serve is by praying for one another. We obviously do this in person, during Worship, and on Wednesday evenings. And, over the years we have come up with ways of sharing concerns throughout the week. How many of you remember the phone prayer chain calls? As technology advanced, we went to email notifications and today we do this by texting.

We take this mode of informing for granted, but I thought that I would take this opportunity to explain a few of the nuts and the bolts of the system.

Now, there are programs that you can buy and use to send out group prayer texts, but these are expensive. Instead, Pastor Tyler and I just use the texting on our personal cell phones to make this happen. Overall, this works very well, but there are some limitations with the system.

First, when you send your prayer concerns, we send them out to over one-hundred cell numbers (praise God we have that many people who want to pray for others!). This is quite manageable by copying and pasting. The downside to sending out that many is that they can be read as potential spam. The more phones they are sent to, the more likely they will be marked as spam. To get around this we do not send a text once, but we use groups of smaller numbers to send them out. I presently send out texts to ten different groups.

Due to this it can take a couple of minutes to send out texts. Also, I might be in the middle of something when you text. Perhaps I am driving down the road, or visiting with someone in the hospital (humorously, while typing this I received a prayer text, so I stopped typing to send it out). Give me an hour to send out your text, I promise I will pray and send; if it takes longer, you are welcome to check in with me.

Remember that everyone is part of a group. If you respond by asking a question of the person who sent the prayer concern, unless they are a part of your group, they will not see your comment. It is best to just send that individual a text directly.

I frequently edit people's texts. Please don't take this personally, but they cannot be too long, or they will be marked as spam and cause problems with sending out.

Also, please be aware of the time that you are sending your text. With various bedtimes for different people, I only do texts between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m. Believe it or not, I have received texts on Sunday morning during Worship (I leave my cell phone on my desk during Worship; I remember one time that I did not see the text for about two hours because I had a meeting and folks who needed to talk). Not fussing, I am just asking you to be aware.

We are always happy to add more people to our prayer chain system. If you are not presently a part of this ministry, please let us know and we will be happy to add you. I don't mind adding more groups!

Thank you for taking James' admonition to pray for one another seriously. May we continue to be faithful in approaching the Lord's throne of grace!
