Dear Church Family,

Thank you for being a people of prayer! It doesn't take long being around the Kimberlin Creek family to know that prayer is a priority in our "life together." We pour out our needs and concerns to our Heavenly Father in a regular basis: in times of worship, in times of study; when we gather for meals, when we gather for work. Prayer is a normal part of us being the body of Christ.

Can we improve in our daily communications with our Lord? I know that I am never satisfied in this vital discipline in my life, and I suspect many of you feel the same.

How can we seek to go deeper and richer in our times before our Lord's throne of grace? In my readings this week, I was reminded of the basics and wanted to share these thoughts with you all.

The Letter of James is full of vital directions for our Christian walk, including our prayer life. James 5:13 speaks to the need for balance in our prayers: "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise."

Without question, our Lord wants us to bring our sufferings, our cares, our concerns to Him. We are admonished in Philippians 4:6 to "not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

What does "supplication" mean? It's a word that we don't use much anymore, but it describes the fervency of our prayers perfectly: "the action of asking or begging for something earnestly or humbly." Praise God, no need of ours is so small to keep to ourselves. He wants to hear it all!

The other half of prayer is just as vital: "Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise." Our Lord wants us to bring Him our needs, but that is not the only time He wants to hear from us. After all, we are called upon to be joyful people, and we have something to joyful about: "For the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Nehemiah 8:10).

In our prayers it is easy to focus on only the asking, only mentioning our needs and the needs of others. Let us be faithful in keeping our prayer life balanced, including both supplications and praises. And as we do so, we will find our prayers becoming richer and deeper indeed.

May we be encouraged today and everyday by the fact that our Lord wants to talk with us! No need is too slight, and no joy is too little as we come to our Lord's throne of grace!

[48] He saw them straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. I'm so glad that when it seems we can't go on and the storms of life are beating us up, as long as we keep our trust in him that Jesus will come walking on the water of life's troubled sea. So remember that when the billows round you roll and the boisterous winds of Satan may blow we can be kept in the hollow of His hand we can rest assured in His plan, and what a comfort just to know that our Lord is in control in the midst of it all.
