Dear Church Family,

There are so many things in life that we take for granted. Those things that we have always been surrounded by and assume that they have always been present.

As Baptists, we are very accustomed to knowing, praying, and supporting missionaries. While I praise God that mission support today is very much a part of our Baptist DNA, it has not always been this way.

Back in merry old England, in 1792, a group of Baptists got together and formed “The Particular Baptist Society for Propagating the Gospel among the Heathen” (fortunately it was soon shortened to the “Baptist Missionary Society”). It took them a few months to decide where on the globe they would begin their sharing of the Gospel and praying about who would go.

Again, there are so many things that we take for granted. The ease of transportation that we have today did not exist for them. The journey from Britain to India (their choice for the first mission) was a four to five-month sea voyage, not a 24-hour plane ride. I frequently receive messages via the internet from missionaries, almost instantly. As you may have guessed, back then it took nearly a year to send a letter to India and receive a reply.

As this group met to pray, they quickly became overwhelmed. They knew with all their hearts that God was leading them to begin this evangelistic effort, yet the task seemed daunting.

While they struggled over who would go, one of those present remarked that, “there is a gold mine in India, but it seems almost as deep as the center of the earth. Who will venture to explore it?” Among those gathered that day in January 1793, William Carey, spoke up and said, “I will go down, but remember that you must hold the ropes.”

Praise God, Carey did just that. He left in July of that year and arrived in November. He remained the rest of his days in India sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ, where he died in 1834.

Volumes are written concerning the life of Carey and how God blessed his faithfulness. But I want you to notice that he did not do it all on his own. He was empowered by the Lord for this ministry, and he was supported by British Baptists who were committed to “hold the ropes.” It was truly a team effort.

Brothers and Sisters, doing ministry is still a team effort. As Pastor Tyler and I seek to serve and minister in the Lord’s name every day, we need you to “hold the ropes.”

Does that include being an active partner in the ministry of our Church? Yes.

Does that include your committed attendance in worship and Bible study? Yes.

Does that include faithfully returning the Lord’s tithe and giving of your offerings? Yes.

And, without question, it includes your devoted prayers on our behalf.

It is truly a privilege to serve you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, “for we are God’s fellow workers (1 Corinthians 3:9).” Thank you for “holding the ropes” and not taking the work of the Lord for granted!

As we enter the season of the World Mission Offering, thank you for your committed giving and prayers for our missionaries, Nzunga and Kihomi, as we are together a part of “holding the ropes” for them. Our WMO goal is \$1,000.00. Let’s faithfully meet and exceed this challenge!
