DISASTER RELIEF

Perhaps you have been following the devastating effects of the hurricanes that landed this fall. Numerous states were impacted. While I don't take groups to these states, my heart goes out to these people and I am following some of the recovery process in Western North Carolina. There are numerous groups on Facebook that share information—the pictures show roads washed out, trees uprooted, landslides, houses damaged or gone completely and even some streams/creeks/small rivers actually relocated after all the flooding. Many people are still living in tents/temporary housing. Most people now have electricity and some have had their water services restored but there is still much need for assistance/volunteers to help due to the large geographic area impacted.

Indian-Kentuck Baptist Church (outside of Madison) led a group of volunteers to the area to help in October and are currently putting together a toy drive. You can read about it in this week's issue of *The Observer* e-mail version that was just published on Thursday, November 21.

Another way you can help is to visit the area. This region is highly dependent upon tourists for their local economy. So if you are looking for a getaway, visit this region—just check with the town you want to visit to make sure they are actually open to tourists (some are but others are not). There are again many postings on Facebook that give this information.
