We hope your church is supporting our Edna Martin Christian Center food drive this month. Our association is one of the biggest contributors among ABC churches of Indiana that give to the Edna Martin Christian Center food pantry. We are also fortunate in that we may be the only association in the state of Indiana that makes this a joint project with both AB Men and ABWM! Our men are as passionate about this as the women and that is a wonderful blessing. We will meet on Saturday, February 8, at Aldi's in Seymour at 9 am to load the food that we have ordered. We will also spend any additional funds that have been provided. Once loaded, we will travel to the Edna Martin Christian Center to offload our goods. It is always a fun- filled day for all of our participants! Some of this work is outdoors so dress accordingly. If you have never helped with this project, I encourage you to do so!

Mission Trips

Our team met and has begun planning 2 of this year's mission trips. The first one will be on March 23-26, 2025; we will be going to Winchester/Randolph County in Indiana. This area had an EF-3 tornado on

March 14, 2024, and had numerous structures destroyed or damaged so we will help them with their rebuilding. Registration forms will be available in early February; participants from the age of 10 years and older are invited to join us. There is no cost to participants.

Our second trip will be June 9-13, 2025, and we will be going to Western North Carolina. They had hurricane Helene last fall with widespread destructions of homes, roads, businesses, etc. Many details for this trip have yet to be completed. There is no cost to participants.

Funding our Mission Trips

We are looking into additional ways of funding our mission trips. As you know, there is no cost to any of our participants. This allows all people to attend. We use a small amount of our donations to cover our expenses but mostly we leave monetary gifts or needed items in the communities where we serve. If we have more funds, we can give even more to these communities. Since this is an effort that involves all ABC churches in Indiana/KY, we will continue to ask for donations. This year we will be doing more fund raising as well.

One of the new methods of raising funds is to ask each of the Coffee Creek Baptist Association Churches to collect a special offering once per year. We have chosen the last Sunday in February which is February 23. We presented this idea to the Executive Committee for our Association last year and they approved it. This is not meant to reduce your church's tithes but hopefully one where people will give an offering just for this mission. Please use your typical method of collecting special offerings for this process. We ask that once the money is collected, someone write a check made payable to "CCA ABWM" and mail it to Grace Flynn at 139 N. Sharon Dr., Scottsburg, IN, 47170. She is our treasurer and will deposit your gift into our checking account. (The mission trip team shares a checking account with the Association ABWM—Grace is very meticulous in tracking the funds between the 2 organizations and this has prevented the mission team from having to set up another non-profit checking account.)
