Dear Church Family,

What comes to mind when you think about the Bible? Is it God's holy word? Is it direction in a turbulent world? Is it your source of peace amid crises? Is it just a collection of old stories, something that we have to put up with in church? Or, is it a magic talisman in your life?

You might think the last option is ridiculous—who would think like that?—but stick with me here.

I have not seen it in years but when I was growing up, I would frequently see Bibles sitting in the back of cars. Before all the hatch back vehicles, do you remember when cars had that little, shelf area under the rear window? That's where I would see them.

When I was young, I remember wondering why someone would throw their Bibles there—they looked discarded. Later, I started thinking that they probably set them there after going to church. Then I noticed how faded the covers were, bleached out by sunlight there in that spot over time. It was then that I realized that the driver had put a Bible there on purpose!

Why would they do that? It was obvious from the condition of their Bibles that they had not been moved in a very long time. The only thing I could decipher was that they thought it was a "good luck charm" or a religious item to give them protection. A Protestant religious medal!

In our devotional time, Pam and I are reading Sinclair Ferguson's *Things Unseen, One Year of Reflection on the Christian Life*. This week we read of how the Scottish Reformer, John Knox, said that if anyone should question his teachings that they should respond "from the mouth of God." As Ferguson realized that Knox was speaking of the Bible, he said, "It wasn't John Knox who came up with that expression! It's how Jesus described the Bible." Then he quoted our Lord from Matthew 4:4— "Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

That description of the Bible really caught my attention. How many times have I heard folks say, "I just

wish that God would speak to me." Well, He has! When we read from His holy word we are literally hearing from the "mouth of God."

Do we really believe we are reading and handling God's very voice? What a difference it makes in how we approach and receive the Bible in our lives. Do we seek direction from it's words? Do we find peace in it's pages? Is it something that comes alive that we long to spend time with in our lives? Or, do we try to use it like an amulet, never to be opened?

Let us approach the Bible with an attitude of reverence. We must dedicate time to read and digest the life-giving words of God that are given for His glory and for our daily lives. Let us hang on every word as if they are from the mouth of God Himself, because they are that indeed!

We must carve out time in our busy lives to embrace God's word. Find time—no make time—daily to hang on to every word "breathed out by God" (II Timothy 3:16).

As a church we take seriously embracing the "living and active" word of God (Hebrews 4:12). From the weekly proclaiming of God's word through the sermon, time for Sunday school, Wednesday evening studies for every age group, and now our Small Group ministries, we make the hearing, reading, and study of the Bible the center of our lives as a church. Do we make these times a priority in our walk with the Lord, or do we take them for granted?

Let us never take God's word for granted but let us devote our limited time to the precious words of life! Remember: "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches" (Revelation 2:7).

Who are you following? Here we are in March and still the top news stories are what our government leaders are doing, or not doing. In a day and age where we have more media platforms than ever before there seems to be no escape from the constant barrage from both sides of the aisle. It doesn't take long before we are dazed and confused about which direction we are headed. As I was thinking about this the other day the Lord slipped up beside me and reminded me that as children of God he is still our leader. I was reveling in this thought and an old hymn came to my mind and gave me assurance that our God still has his children's best interest at heart if we will just shut out the noise and focus on him. The hymn was written in 1875 by Fanny J. Crosby to a tune written by the Baptist minister Dr. Robert Lowry. The story goes that Fanny was in need of some money and didn't have anyone to go to so she went to God in prayer. It wasn't long a man came by and gave her five dollars which was the exact amount she needed. Later recalling the incident, she said "I have no way of accounting for this except to believe that God put it into the heart of this good man to bring the money". The poem she wrote afterward became All The Way My Savior Leads Me. Even though this was written 150 years ago it still has the power to speak to hearts today. It is hard to pick just one stanza to claim as a favorite, but in the confusion of our current world I especially like the stanza that says "All the way my Savior leads me. Cheers each winding path I tread. Gives me strength for every trial, feeds me with the living bread. Tho my weary steps may falter, and my soul a thirst may be, gushing from the rock before me lo a spring of joy I see". Isn't it so good to know that even in 2025 that rock before us is Jesus Christ, and from him flow springs of joy, peace and contentment. So no matter what confusion or direction the world tries to pull us, just remember that our leader is still Jesus Christ and he can make streams of joy appear in our darkest hour. 


